From the President's Desk

Buon Natale and happy December to all! I hope you made it through the heavy downpours that we had in mid November and that you had a great giorno del ringraziamento after you dried out a bit. I also hope you were able to join us for our English program in November, entitled "Some Italian Renaissance Sculpture, Mainly Florence, All Davids", presented by Dan DeMatteis. It was a fascinating look into the history of the sculptures of David and the message behind each. Thank you Dan for a great presentation! Thank you as well to Sylvia Shiroyama for the wonderful dinner she prepared, I know everyone enjoyed it! As we do every year, there was no Italian language program in November.

In November SIFF held the annual New Italian Film Festival and the Dante Alighieri Society was proud to be a sponsor again this year. The film collection was great again and I hope all of you were able to see some of them. All reports are that the shows were very well attended and a fun time was had by all who attended.

In December we have two great events that I hope you can attend. First, on Saturday the 1st was our Festa di Natale per i Bambini. This is a great event for children to experience a real Italian Christmas tradition and to have a great time with the crafts, eating pizzelle, and of course the presepio. I really hope you and your children, grandchildren, nieces, and nephews were able to join us.

Our second event is our annual Christmas party which is held instead of our usual English meeting on December 12th. This party is a great time every year for visiting with each other, singing, and playing our annual game of Tombola. Giuseppe's calling of the numbers for Tombola last December made the game so much fun we declared that he is hired for life! There is no program and no designated cook for the party so please bring something to share; it's always fun to share your favorite vino, antipasti, or dolce. There is no Italian language program in December so this will be our last chance to get together before the end of the year, I hope you can make it!

Speaking of traditions, as we approach Christmas this year, the Paterra family has committed to having our Christmas dinner in the tradition of the feast of the seven fishes. I spent some time researching this to find its origin and meaning and I found many explanations, none of which I can say are authoritative. The meal consists of a number of fish courses, between 7 and 13 dishes, depending on what your family tradition dictates with fish being served in deference to the tradition of not eating meat on the eve of specific celebration days. The number of dishes served relates to various religious beliefs. The number 7, which appears 700 times in the Bible, may be related to the 7th day from Genesis when God rested, or the number of sacraments. The number 13 points to Jesus and his 12 apostles. I'm sure there are reasons for having 8 or 9 dishes as well. As I did this research I also looked for recipes and found 2 antipasti, 4 primi piatti, and 1 secondi piatti which gets me to 7, all from the Dante cookbook. I think we are going to have a feast!

As we wind down this year I want to take a moment to say thank you again to all of you for what you do for our organization. I'm looking forward to working with you again in 2013.

Language Program News by Giuseppe Tassone

Italian Language Program Director

The 2012-13 Italian Language Program of the Dante Alighieri Society of Washington started on October 2nd with 63 students enrolled.

Starting this year we have changed the structure of our classes to better respond to the standards of the PLIDA (Progetto Lingua Italiana Dante Alighieri) Italian language proficiency certification. Following the Common European Framework of Reference, we divided our classes into 3 levels: A1 *Beginning Italian*, A2 *Elementary Italian* and B1 *Intermediate Italian*.

Currently, we have 16 students enrolled in level A2 and 19 in level B1 so it is very likely next year we will add level B2 *Fundamental Italian* if most of the current B1 students continue with their studies.

If any of our students are interested in receiving a certificate attesting his/her level of Italian, the Italian Language Program of the Dante Alighieri Society of Washington offers PLIDA exams in May and November at Seattle University.

Knowledgeable and qualified instructors with many years of experience in our program teach our classes. This year Daniel Zanchi (Level A1) and Laura Ciroi (Level B1) are celebrating ten years of commitment in our program. To Daniel, Laura, and Michela Tartaglia (Level A2) go my gratitude for their hard work and dedication. Their contribution help me to continue running a successful program and give the joy of learning Italian to hundreds of students every year.

Students praise our program not only for the quality but also for the informal setting and friendly atmosphere in the classroom that enable them to make progress and attend class regularly even after a day of work. Our classes meet at 7:00 p.m.!

In addition to their language instruction, our students are invited to participate in cultural events and lectures related to Italy presented by the *Dante Alighieri Society of Washington* and other institutions such as *Seattle University – Modern Languages and Cultures*, the *University of Washington – Italian Board* and the *Seattle-Perugia Sister City Association*. The Dante Alighieri of Washington is once again a sponsor of the New Italian Film Festival at SIFF. Our students traditionally attend the Festival and discuss the films in class.

Although our program began in the fall and ends in June, if anyone is interested they can contact me to be placed in the appropriate level. The next quarter starts Thursday, January 8th. Registration deadline is December 21st.

The Dante Alighieri of Washington Italian Language Program is a non-profit self-sustaining program operating exclusively with the income from the tuition and the generosity of Seattle University that is hosting our classes.

PLIDA

PLIDA (Progetto Lingua Italiana Dante Alighieri)

The Dante Alighieri Society of Washington in Seattle is an official examination center of the Società Dante Alighieri and provides its students and others the opportunity of taking PLIDA exams in order to obtain a PLIDA certificate.

The PLIDA Certificate

The PLIDA certificate is an official Diploma issued by the Società Dante Alighieri under an agreement with the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the University of Rome *La Sapienza*. It is recognized by the Italian Ministry of Labour and Social Policies and by the Italian Ministry of University and Research as a qualification for the profiency in the Italian language for foreigners.

The PLIDA certificates attest proficiency in Italian as a foreign language on a 6-level scale according to the parameters established by the Common European Framework for Languages (A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2).

Why Take the PLIDA Exam

Students who may wish to be certified include those who plan to study at Italian universities (which accepts PLIDA Certification as proof of proficiency), American high school and college students who may seek college credit, or persons wishing to be certified for obtaining an application for the Italian Permit of Stay in Italy. Certification may also interest students who see the examination as a capstone experience after taking their language courses.

Dates, Registration, Location, and Exam Fees

PLIDA certificate sessions will be held every year in May and November. Candidates may choose to take an exam at the level they feel is closest to their proficiency. Registration does not require having taken lower-level tests.

Candidates need to register approximately 30 days prior to the exam date. Dates for the 2012 exams are November 29th (Levels A1, A2, B1) and November 30th (Levels B2, C1, C2) with registration due no later than November 8th. Exams are held at Seattle University. The Seattle chapter of the Dante Alighieri Society has published a long-awaited cookbook from Dante members called *La Cucina della Dante*.




