

Registration is open until September 25th. Don't miss the deadline. We would love to have you in our program as a new or continuing student. Arrivederci!



The Italian Connection: Seattle Through the Decades

Josef Scaylea: NW Photography Icon



Stark, dramatic, bold. These words describe the work of Josef Scaylea, a Seattle Times photographer for more than 35 years.

The son of Italian immigrants, Scaylea grew up in Connecticut. His family name was originally Scaglia, but it was changed so it was easier to pronounce. During World War II, Scaylea was stationed at Paine Field where he experienced for the first time the natural beauty of the Northwest. He told himself he'd return some day – and he did, eventually becoming chief photographer for The Seattle Times.

Scaylea was known for his portraits of everyday men and women, working on a ferry or fishing boat, in front of a barn or gathering hay in the fields. He also specialized in outdoor photos -- fishermen at Snoqualmie Falls or a skier doing a backwards flip. His landscapes looked more like abstract art than photography.

Besides more than three decades as a photojournalist, Scaylea published seven books and won more than 1,000 awards. He died in 2004. <u>Read the full story here.</u>
